New Business:

PowerDMS: There is a recent update in Power DMS. A few changes to C size agencies standards going from optional to mandatory such as Workload assessment. ID and Show up standard word change.

ACLU survey: ACLU released a survey report on accepting civilian complaints at Connecticut Police Departments. Chief Fitzgerald advised the information published about Berlin PD was inaccurate. They were able to track down the audio of the survey phone call. The call lasted about 8 to 10 minutes and the written report is contradictory to the dispatcher's answers. CPCA probably will not address the survey unless it goes to the legislature. Most Departments will probably not be able to locate the survey phone call. Best rebuttal may just be that the survey is not scientific so they should do a scientific survey. Survey lists IACP and CALEA as good sources for policy guidelines.
